

- ③ Original compositions by participant will not be accepted.
- ④ You may perform multiple pieces from a single suite or variation, as long as they are within the designated performance time. Intermission between pieces shall be included in the designated time.

[Judging Philosophy]

The judging for this competition will be focused on the musical expression, not just the technique.

Therefore, whether you choose an easy piece or a difficult piece, you will be evaluated according to your own expression.

In particular, we will evaluate the following points.

1. Whether the performance shows your willingness to express yourself.

- Whether you are putting your emotions into the sound and trying to convey them to the audience.
- \cdot Whether you try to do your best.
- Whether you have a positive and enthusiastic attitude.
- 2. Whether the performance shows the results of the lesson you have taken.
- Whether the results of your efforts to create a beautiful sound are apparent.
- Whether you understand the characteristics and elements of the piece (beat, rhythm, dynamics, phrasing, chord movement, balance of notes in each part, use of pedals, etc.) and express them in your performance.
- Whether you understand and perform the differences in the characteristics of music depending on the era in which the music was composed, the type of music, and the composer.

<To instructors>

It is often believed that the students' own individual expression is unlikely to occur in the beginning of the piano lesson because the directions by the instructor have a great influence on the students' performance.

However, we believe that there are cases in which the students' own individual expression comes out to some extent in their performance as the study progresses, or the students actively express their individuality from the beginning of the study.

Therefore, the performance in this competition will be evaluated as the result of the collaboration between the instructor and the student, in which the individuality of each student is expressed to the fullest.
